Today we are celebrating the Feast of St. Francis. Because St. Francis had such a loving relationship with the natural world, it has become a tradition for the church to offer blessings on pets and other beloved animals. Blessing farm animals and other wildlife is certainly older than Francis. During Rogation days, and especially during the long processions through the parish neighborhoods, all kinds of animal and plant life was blessed. Though there is certainly no theological or liturgical reason to not bless pets and other beloved animal life during Rogation Day, the blessing of pets, especially, has migrated over to St. Francis day. St. Francis day is now widely celebrated in Episcopal Churches throughout the country. Since this has occurred, it probably makes sense to break up the blessing of animal life to today's liturgy. The 10:00 will have the Blessing of the Animals Liturgy. It is not always the smoothest service, but that is part of the tradition. St. Francis was the inventor of the Nativity Play, or Christmas Pageant. He insisted on using live animals, and it was not unusual for the sheep to begin munching on the hay in the baby Jesus' crib. The God of scripture clearly has a sense of humor, so I encourage you to find the joy in this liturgy even if things go awry.
