Our first and second scripture readings at St. John's are done from a well-sculpted lectern on the epistle side of the church. Eagle lecterns have always been popular in churches in the Anglican communion, and there use dates to the middle ages. The eagle is a symbol of St. John, so it is very appropriate to have this piece of liturgical furniture with us. This lectern style can be found in many places not named after St. John, and some argue the two uses of the eagle are coincidental. The eagle is also famous for its eyesight, and there was a medieval hypothesis that this high-flying bird had some ability to look into the sun and not have damaged eyesight. The symbol being that the light of the truth of the scriptures could be looked at without damage. Perhaps similar to the way the burning bush was not consumed by the fire. The eagle is also a great flyer, so there is the symbolism of the Word of God traveling all over the world. Whatever the reason you prefer, it is a beautiful piece. You may also notice that the wood used does not match the other wood used in the building. The lectern is one of the few pieces that came over from St. John's Church in Rockville. This makes the lectern one of the oldest treasurers we have in our modern parish.

Eucharistic Visitors wanted! - In January, during the Epiphany season, we hope that the members of St. John's will expand on an important lay ministry, that of Lay Eucharistic Visitor (EV). EV's are lay people licensed by the Diocese to bring Holy Eucharist from a Sunday service to parishioners who cannot be at the service due to infirmity. Deacon and Fr. Marc will be starting a process of helping interested parishioners to get trained and licensed after the Christmas season. If you are interested in serving in this way, please talk with Fr. Marc or Deacon Scott as they will be scheduling the training soon.

Advent Series - This year's Advent series will take place on Thursday evenings from 6:00pm to 8:00pm on December 14th, and 21st. We will begin our time with a soup supper. The center of our discussion will be on Bishop Wright's devotional book, *Advent for Everyone*. There is a short devotional reading for each day and a discussion question. We will be discussing a few of those questions each week. Like last year, we will conclude our time with a brief Eucharist.
