Happy Anniversary! James & Susan Hutton **Guest Organist for Sunday's Service** – *Heeyon Cha* will be filling in for Zoe this week while she is on vacation. Heeyeon Cha is a highly accomplished organist and harpsichordist, originally from South Korea. Before relocating to Branford, Connecticut, she was based in Texas, where she served as the organist for St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Houston. Heeyeon has performed solo organ recitals at prominent venues such as Christ Church Cathedral, Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, St. Philip Presbyterian, South Main Baptist Church, Houston Christian University, and Christ the King Catholic Church in Dallas. As a harpsichordist, she has appeared with esteemed ensembles and festivals, including Bach Society Houston, Houston Early Music, the Shenandoah Valley Bach Festival, the Amherst Early Music Festival, and other musical events across Greater Houston. She is also a co-founder of the baroque trio *La Joie*. Heeyeon holds a Certificate of Music Performance (C.M.P.) in organ from the University of Houston, a Master of Music (M.M.) degree from the University of Washington, and a Bachelor of Music (B.M.) degree from Presbyterian University and Theological Seminary in Seoul, South Korea. She studied organ with Daryl Robinson and harpsichord with Matthew Dirst at the University of Houston's Moore School of Music.

**Creation Care Sunday** - Sunday September 22<sup>nd</sup> will be celebrated as Creation Care Sunday. This will be a time to pray and reflect on our environment and draw attention to environmental issues and ministries. As has been encouraged in the past, the congregation is challenged to walk, bike, or carpool to church that morning. Our environment is a creation of God, and it needs our prayers. The prophet Micah so beautifully wrote that "God has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." All nominations will be reviewed by the committee. The slate of a new vestry will be voted on by the congregation at the next Annual Meeting on January 26, 2025.
