Next week, we will have a visit from one of the most important officials in the Episcopal Church in Connecticut. The Rev. Ranjit Mathews is the Canon to the Ordinary. I know that sounds strange to many people, especially non-Episcopalians. It sounds even more exotic when you factor in that our diocese has not had a Canon to the Ordinary in many years. This position is essentially the Bishop's right-hand-man and advisor. These canon's often handle situations that require some real knowledge and expertise.
