## The Week of Christian Unity

Pat Cleveland discovered the hidden prize in the Kings' Cake and was crowned queen for the day at last week's Lunch Bunch!



Father Paul Wattson started an important observance in New York back in 1908. It is now called the Week of Prayer for Christianity Unity (traditionally Jan 18-Jan 25). Wattson realized that churches seemed to be getting increasingly sectarian not seeing how valuable other Christians are. Christ's high priestly prayer which included the line that we should "all be one" seemed to be ignored by the various denominations. In the Anglican Communion, great efforts had been made in the previous generation to recognize our common mission. In 1886, the House of Bishops of the Episcopal Church adopted what would later be known as the Chicago-Lambeth Quadrilateral. The Lambeth Conference of 1888 also endorsed the concept. The idea was to explain to the wider church what was most crucial to the faith of Episcopalians and that we were open to ecumenical dialogue. These talks would be beneficial in themselves but also could lead to reunification with other denominations. The Quadrilateral focused on the importance of scripture, the Nicene Creed, the sacraments of baptism and Eucharist, and the historic Episcopate. (The statement can be found on page 877 in the BCP). This declaration is still supported by our church today and has led to fruitful dialogues with other denominations. Wattson understood the importance of high-level talks with church leaders and theologians, but he wanted to see more work done at the parish level. He wanted the regular people in the pews to focus on Christian unity, and he understood that it would only be through prayer and the changing of attitudes by the faithful that could lead to real progress in ecumenical relationships. Today we remember that we have siblings in Christ throughout the world who do not all call themselves the same things. Perhaps they do not share all of our theology and politics. but they are important to our common life. We all have much more in common than what divides us. Let us pray for unity. Blessings, Marc
